September in the Garden

\*Prune roses lightly and remove old or dead canes\*\*Use a slow-release fertilizer\*\*Water slowly to a depth of 2 feet. Allow the soil to dry out between waterings, but don't allow the plant to become stressed\*\*\*Remove spent blooms. (from the U of A Co-op Ext.)
